Speaker Biographies

Jim Thomas

Programme Head of Workforce Innovation, Skills for Care

Jim Thomas is Skills for Care's Programme Head for Workforce Innovation. Skills for Care is the employer led workforce development body for adult social care in England.

Jim has been engaged in social care and health for over 30 years. He worked as Cambridgeshire County Council and Cambridgeshire Health Authorities Joint Training organiser in the 1990's, running a programme of integrated learning and development across social care and health. He has also worked for the Valuing People Support Team as their expert advisor on workforce development. He was closely involved in the development of national and local safeguarding training programmes and strategy in the 1990's and has stayed in touch with developments ever since.

Since joining Skills for Care in 2007 he has led a broad range of national programmes of workforce Innovation. These include developing and testing a framework for workforce redesign in adult social care, the development of principles for workforce integration, a programme on skills led approaches to community development and a range of workforce guidance in relation to safeguarding. His current work includes workforce commissioning, a commissioning for wellbeing qualification, developing the workforce supporting people with a learning disability and the workforce supporting people with autism and exploring workforce issue around all aspects of digital working, learning, information sharing and the use of data.

Head of Safeguarding, NHS England

Kenny Gibson is the National Head of Safeguarding for the NHS, overseeing several portfolios including Exploitation, Contextual Safeguarding; Trauma Informed Care; Prevent in the NHS and Child Protection Information System.

Having begun his NHS career as a laundry assistant in 1980 at a mental health unit, Kenny was encouraged to become a nursing assistant and then trained as a nurse and then a midwife.

Kenny has held various operational, management and strategic posts in both community and public health but always with nursing at the heart of these roles.

Prior to becoming the Head of Safeguarding for NHS England, Kenny was the Head of Public Health Commissioning for London.

Kenny is passionate about connecting with and listening to patients, carers and health practitioners in order to improve services and experiences within the NHS, as well as to empower people about their own well-being.

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Member, Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel, Department for Education

Sarah Elliott has recently completed a 3 year contract as the Independent Chair for the Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole Local Safeguarding Children Board and the Dorset Local Safeguarding Children Boards. She took up the role in July 2016 following a long career in the NHS where Sarah worked as a Nurse, Health Visitor and in professional leadership roles across a range of organisations. Before retiring from the NHS, Sarah was the Chief Nurse for the South of England where she led on the quality and safeguarding agenda along with multi agency initiatives such as the Transforming Care Programme for People with a Learning Disability.

Sarah Elliott is a member of the National Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel for England which was formed in July 2018. She is also a special advisor with the Care Quality Commission and an Assessor with the College of Policing for senior policing appointments.

Lesley Pollard

Managing Director, Chiypep

Lesley has been the Managing Director of the Children and Young People's Empowerment project for 18 years, a National Charity based in Sheffield. Her role includes responsibility for the overall strategic and operational management of the organisation, as well as securing and managing funding and investment, establishing partnerships and networks, and leading the staff team. She delivers training and consultancy on behalf of the Chiypep, supporting organisations to develop Involvement and Participation strategies and practice.

Currently the organisation supports young people to influence Future in Mind Transformation plans in Barnsley and Sheffield, and delivers innovative projects including an Emotional Literacy programmes for vulnerable Boys and Young Men; empowering Girls and Young Women affected by domestic and sexual abuse, a Personal Health Budget pilot project for Looked After children, a Social Cohesion project, Peer Mentoring Programmes, and Youth Mental Health First Aid and Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training for professions and communities.

She holds a Qualification in Youth and Community Development, a Cert Ed Post 16 and a Post Graduate qualification in Management in Health and Social Care.

Previously, she worked as the Domestic Abuse Coordinator for Rotherham, and as a Participation Officer for the Children's Society, where she delivered the NSPCC safeguarding training programme nationally for the organisation.

Her background as a practitioner in Youth and Community Development work with Rotherham Youth Service and Voluntary Action Rotherham gave her on the ground experience of face to face work with vulnerable children, young people and adults.

Head of Safeguarding Adults, NHS Bolton CCG

Kaleel is a Qualified Social Worker and he has spent almost 20 years specialising in adult mental health, learning disability and forensic psychiatry working across the private, local authority and the health sector. He started his career in child protection prior to working with adults both in a hospital and community setting. Kaleel is the Head of Safeguarding Adults, Mental Capacity Act, Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards and Prevent lead for NHS Bolton CCG. He is currently the Deputy Chair of the Greater Manchester Safeguarding Adult and the Integrated Children and Adults networks providing leadership across the local health system. He is a member of the Greater Manchester Local Authority Safeguarding Managers network to ensure health is represented in social care and vice versa. He holds a BSc in Health and Social Care, MSc in Mental Health Practice and MA in Safeguarding Adults, Policy and Practice. He is also a qualified Best Interest Assessor.

Harmful Content Manager, South West Grid for Learning Trust

Kathryn Tremlett manages the UK's Report Harmful Content project which provides a mediatory service to members of the public who are dealing





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with harmful content online. She also works as a practitioner on the Professionals Online Safety Helpline which forms part of the Safer Internet Centre in the UK. On a day to day basis her work involves providing holistic advice and support to professionals working with young people seeking help with online issues. Kathryn contributes to and helps create resources in the field of Online Safety, including updating the UK Safer Internet Centre's most popular resources: The Social Media Checklists. When not answering calls she can be found responding to local and national media requests which involve live radio and television broadcasts, writing articles for in-house and external media publications and providing support to the wider UK Safer Internet Centre team.

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Richard Painter

Director of Safeguarding, Somerset Partnership and Taunton & Somerset NHS Foundation Trust

Rich had a career in local authority social care services in Hampshire and Dorset for 18 years before moving across to the NHS in 2009. Rich had a varied career within social care in front line child protection work, working with adults and children with disabilities, residential children's homes and as a LADO. He has in recent years led Safeguarding Services in NHS Trusts in Somerset and has most recently led the development of an Integrated Safeguarding Service serving two trusts. Rich is an active member of both the adult and children safeguarding boards and chairs the Child Exploitation subgroup for Somerset. The Integrated safeguarding Service covers safeguarding adults and children, domestic abuse and MARAC, MAPPA, PREVENT, MCA, DoLS, and consent and a Children Looked After service. The 25 strong service supports 9,000 staff working in an acute hospital, community health and mental health services as well as a public health nursing service located within the local authority.

Author of the 'Being Fair' Report and Senior Adviser, NHS Resolution

Dr Suzette Woodward is an internationally renowned expert in patient safety. She has worked in the NHS for 40 years, and specialised in patient safety for over two decades. Suzette has held Executive Board positions at the National Patient Safety Agency and NHS Resolution. For the last five years she was the National Clinical Director for the Sign up to Safety Campaign. Suzette is currently in a joint role as Senior Advisor for the Department of Health and Social Care and NHS Resolution. She is also a Visiting Professor for the Institute of Global Health Innovation at Imperial College University London. She is an author of two books; *Rethinking Patient Safety* and *Implementing Patient Safety*.

Project lead for Professional Online Safety Helpline, UK Safer Internet Centre

Carmel manages the Professionals Online safety helpline in the UK, (operated by the UK safer Internet centre). The helpline offers unique support to the whole of the children's workforce in the UK, dealing with online safeguarding issues. One of the helpline's key strengths is relationships with industry, having open and constructive conversations with social media companies, such as Facebook and Twitter, allows us to understand and help shape policy as well as manage content for our callers. Carmel has written for and contributed to many recognised charities and organisations in the UK such as, Ditch the Label, Internet Matters, VICE and the BBC. She has spoken in parliament as part of the Dare2Care campaign launched by MP Sarah Champion and continues to be an active voice in public discussions around young people's online behaviours.

She studied Law at Trinity Hall College in Cambridge.
