Dear Delegate,

Welcome to Local Government Commercialisation 2020: Generating Income to Support More Effective Public Services.

By 2020, local authorities will have lost nearly £16 billion of core Central Government funding in ten years, whilst simultaneously facing ever greater demand for services. The Local Government Association (LGA) estimates that by 2025 there will be a £7.8 billion funding gap for services, currently provided by local authorities. Despite newly announced funding for some local authority services, a significant funding gap remains.

To tackle increasing budgetary difficulties, councils must devise innovative approaches to create alternative and sustainable income revenue streams. 'Commercialisation' of services is top of the agenda, with 82% of councils investigating some form of additional service or venture to generate income, and 57% considering selling council assets. The LGA has produced a series of briefings on this area, outlining how to implement innovative financial strategies, whilst mitigating risk when borrowing and trading, demonstrating that commercialisation can be done successfully.

Building on our 2019 conference, this event will address the real concerns over funding constraints and demonstrate a range of innovative approaches that local authorities have taken to secure their financial stability through a series of best practice case studies and vital peer-learning networking opportunities. In addition, you will hear an invaluable overview of the funding landscape, with reports on the success and future of local authority commercialisation and borrowing.

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Speaker Biographies

Nigel Ashton

Head of Commercialisation, Southampton City Council

Nigel Ashton is the Head of Commercialisation at Southampton City Council with service responsibility for Housing as well as Income and Expenditure. Having not long started, he is excited at the opportunities for commercial improvement. Previously, he was with Aylesbury Vale District Council from early 2017. During his time there he was heavily involved in promoting the commercial agenda both internally and to over 50 local authorities culminating in a combined £20m increase in income and reduction in costs.

Prior to joining AVDC, Nigel was the Managing Director of Delivering Connections, an independent logistics and consultancy company, primarily involved in transformation within international postal organisations such as Saudi Arabia Post and China Post. Nigel was also the Managing Director of one of the fastest growing sports marketing companies in the UK ultimately involved in player management, shirt sponsorships and perimeter advertising in Premier League football, cricket, F1 Racing and rugby.

Originally qualified as an industrial chemist, this was followed by a 30+ year career in the private sector world of commerce in industries as diverse as ultraviolet water treatment, fenestration, international exhibitions and conferences.

This experience is hopefully now being used to facilitate the need for increased revenue and financial surplus enabling local authorities provide outstanding services.



Andrew Burns Associate Director, CIPFA

Andrew Burns is a former President of the Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA), having served as President in 2017/18. The Institute has over 14,000 members who work throughout the public services, in national audit agencies, in major accountancy firms and in other public bodies where public money needs to be effectively and efficiently managed. As the President he visited a number of countries encouraging sound public financial management. He was also a former Chairman of the Consultative Committee of Accountancy Bodies (CCAB).

Andrew has taken up the role as Associate Director at CIPFA, where his key role is to further develop strong links between CIPFA and local government treasurers' societies and the sector more generally. He is also a trustee of the Centre for Public Scrutiny (CfPS) which is the leading national organisation promoting and supporting excellence in governance and scrutiny across public services.

Abdool Kara joined the NAO in February 2017 as Executive Leader, Local Services.
