Effectively prioritising issues of ASB through monthly partner meetings to improve response time

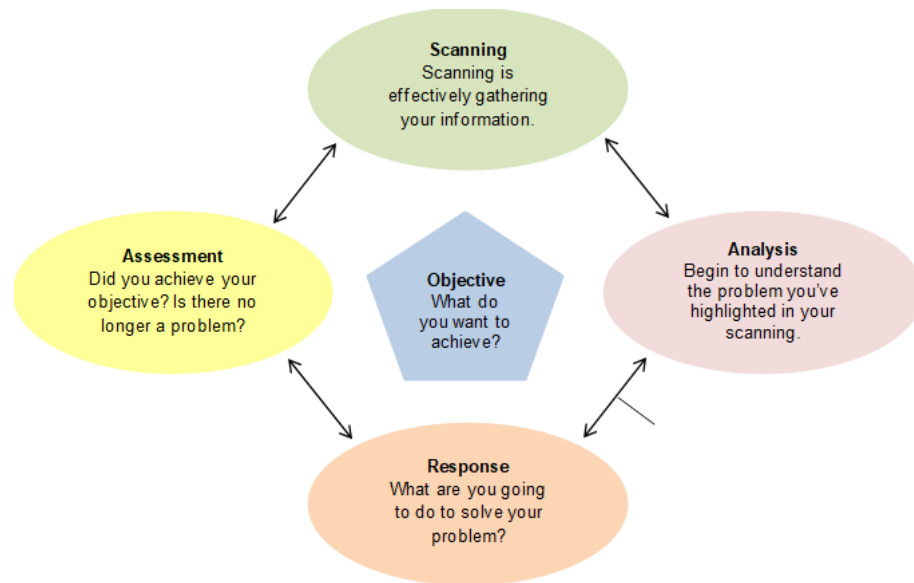
Partner data discussed and presented at monthly meetings and used with information from community and intelligence to set monthly targets, priority locations and community issues.

'Streetsafe surveys' conducted by police and partners to gain views.

Engagement documented with 'hard to reach' communities and their concerns addressed.

Targeted surveys in key areas to identify concerns.

Key tips for agencies to use their powers as part of a coordinated plan to dramatically reduce ASB



Each 'case' has own meeting with appropriate partners.

OSARA model adopted for each case with meeting template to ensure consistency and effective 'scanning'.

Reviewed regularly with additional 'management' reviews.

Multi-agency case access ensures effective tasking and coordinated approach.

Each agency aware of what each other is doing to avoid duplication and agencies being 'played' against each other.
