

Referencing the National Risk Register to develop a Community Risk Register




The aim of the Sussex Resilience Forum Risk and Horizon Scanning working group is to assess the most significant risks to the Sussex community, based on what their impacts might be and to ensure that a right level of multi-agency preparedness has been planned for.

Collaborative Working

- Absolutely essential to ensure LRF Partners are part of the process.
- Work to National Risk Assessment principles & guidelines applying local context of likelihood and impact within Sussex
- Assessments to include threat information supported by Sussex Police and Counter Terrorism Policing South East (CTPSE)




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- Risk assessments must be reviewed by the allocated subject matter expert or 'owner'
 - The Risk Group members will also score risks based on Likelihood and Impact and note the rationale so that a collective and moderated outcome is achieved.



Each Risk is now considered in a 'Local' Context.

- Quite often the CRR aligns with the NRR
- Where there is variance, the rationale and context are provided and recorded on the Risk Matrix.

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- Ensure that risks are reviewed via a multi-agency perspective
 - Ensure support assessments are undertaken in areas where there is local variation, especially for the top ten
 - Identify and report the capability requirements and / or improvements needed to mitigate, minimise and manage the risks

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- Ensure appropriate risks are communicated to neighbouring LRFs and meet with neighbouring LRF Risk Group Chairs regularly.
 - Ensure a register is available to the public and updated where required, working with communication colleagues to ensure public awareness

It's not just about the creation of a Community Risk Register!

- The Community Risk Register needs to be communicated to our communities and shared.
- It must be relevant to our communities
- Provides evidence to support and identify training and exercising programmes
- Identifies where additional mitigations and support are required.
